**Abundance:** Neighbors view the world with abundance over scarcity. Consider the talents you can see when you observe your neighborhood. Does a neighbor plant a beautiful garden that you can compliment them on and thank them for the beauty?

**Relationship:** Relationships are strengthened when we focus on our relationship with God. Practice connecting with God in your neighborhood. Sit in a space where you

can see your neighbors houses and pray for each person who lives next to you. Then do an activity in your front yard that you might normally do inside. Maybe eat a meal on your front porch and simply say "hello" to any neighbors you see. Being available to God and neighbors in these ways are important for growing these relationships.

**Joy:** Neighbors intentionally cultivate joy which is bigger than happiness. This joy can be fostered through storytelling and celebration. People love to tell stories and they love when you listen to their stories. This week look for opportunities to hear and enjoy someone's story. You can go big and include food, decorations, and a card!

### PW Post by Sandy

March seemed real busy, maybe because Easter got squeezed late into the month rather than in April. But, we are so thankful for the messages of Christ rising that we welcome it in either month. April has now come and gone. We enjoyed our Spring PW local gathering at The Breadbasket on April 13<sup>th</sup>. Our group was a little smaller this Spring, but we enjoyed hearing updates on what was going on in our families. We even had a pop-in from Angela Altum and Jenny Gihring (from Idaho) to say "HI" before they headed off for a soccer game.

After our Circle meeting, in May, we'll be sending our "Least Coin" collection from our Circle meetings throughout the year to Presbyterian Women PCUSA (by way of our Presbytery). With this collection being held in 80 countries, an impact is great. The offering is unique because all--regardless of income, education, nationality or home--give only the smallest coin of their currency. All are within the same discipline and share the common concerns of women around the world. Each year, "Least Coins" from around the world make possible several types of grants which support 20-25 initiatives around the world. 2023 funding gave \$52,000 in Block Grants, \$47,000 in Project Grants, \$1,000 in Scholarships and \$8,000 in Emergency Grants through out the world.

Sunday, May 12, we will be observe the 2024 Birthday Offering of Presbyterian Women. Each year, the Birthday Offering awards grants to up to five programs. Primarily making possible capital improvement projects, the Birthday Offering focuses on areas such as agricultural development, child care, community organization, criminal justice, drug counseling, economic justice, elderly care, employment training, homelessness, literacy, violence or women's concerns. Your gift to the Birthday Offering helps fund real solutions in these areas.

Karen Wilson will be giving our Bible study lesson on "Lydia Encounters Jesus in Worship". The main idea is, "Baptism connects us to God and the community of faith." Rita Allmon will be our Circle hostess.


### **Nurture Team:**


